



## Tweedmouth Prior Park First School - Review of School Sports Funding 2024 – 2025

In 2024-2025 we received £16,860 P.E. and School Sport Funding. We spent this in the following ways:

Employ specialist PE teachers and coaches	NUFC Primary Stars programme, including Commando Joe's	£9000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-All children have the opportunity to work with specialist teachers and coaches.</li> <li>-All children in Key stage 1 &amp; 2 have the opportunity to attend a range of after school sporting activities.</li> <li>-Our staff have access to continuing CPD by observing and working alongside specialist teachers and coaches.</li> </ul>	<p>-Our staff have continued to develop confidence and refine their skills by observing and working alongside a range of specialist coaches and teachers. This has been an essential aspect of our ongoing CPD and is helping to improve progress and attainment for all pupils. We see clear progression from Early Years to Year 4.</p> <p>Year 3 &amp; 4 teachers are seeing improvements in the children's agility, balance, co-ordination - in the fundamental skills. They also note improving team work, resilience, determination, self-belief and tolerance - the children are more supportive and encouraging of each other during PE lessons and other sporting activities. Growth in personal development has been noticeable - setting themselves individual goals / seeing how they have improved over a series of lessons. Understanding of tactics is also improving and this is leading to improved reactions in the different sporting activities. There is also increasing evidence of more adaptability within games – using their prior knowledge of how a game or sport works to increase the level of difficulty / challenge for themselves.</p> <p>The children's vocabulary about individual sports is improving. The children are becoming more motivated and eager to participate, especially SEND children who had been reluctant are now becoming much more willing to engage.</p> <p>Activities such as Commando Joe challenges, are supporting the children to actively problem solve – teachers are seeing increased strategic thinking.</p>

				<p>-Working with specialist NUFC coaches is also helping to increase the willingness of the children to participate in community activities, e.g. the Curfew run around the Walls, and other weekly out of school clubs and holiday camps. School regularly shares information with parents about local clubs, events and holiday sporting activities. Children are encouraged to share their external sporting achievements, and these are regularly celebrated in whole school assemblies.</p> <p>-This year all children in Key Stage 1 &amp; 2 had the opportunity to attend separate weekly after school clubs. A different club was offered to each Key Stage each half term. These have been run by specialist NUFC coaches (with school staff) and this has encouraged more children to attend. FSM children have been a focus for attendance at these clubs. There is no charge for attending any of our after-school clubs.</p> <p>Next Year: We will need to start extending this provision into Upper Key Stage 2 when we become a Primary School.</p>

Year 4 were pleased to win all their matches at the July Cricket Festival. Year 3 &amp; 4 were delighted at winning the July Skipping Festival. Year 3 also qualified to represent North Northumberland in the final of the Multi-skills competition.</p> <p>-Year 3 &amp; 4 teachers and NUFC coaches organised Inter-House competitions at the end of each half term, e.g. cricket, hockey, football, rugby, skipping, rounders.</p> <p>-In the Summer Term, our NUFC coach organised a new lunchtime football club for Year 3 &amp; 4 girls. This was well attended.</p> <p>-Year 4 Sports Crew were trained to lead lunchtime activities – to encourage and engage the children in Early Years and Key Stage 1 in physical activity at lunchtime.</p> <p>-Links with Berwick Academy's P.E. department continue to be developed - Sports Leaders from the Academy supported with each of our Sports Days.</p> <p>-Our annual Bike Week encouraged all children to cycle to school and linked with the Air Ambulance 'Miles for Miles' campaign, with all children engaging in a daily cycling session.</p>

This process helped us to reflect critically and supported the continuous improvement of our practice. In 2025-26 we will work towards the Platinum Award.</p>

Transport to local Sporting events / festivals	This will include organisation of a bus and/ or additional staffing to support children to walk to local venues and supervise at the event.	£870	-Children are able to participate in inter school festivals and competitions -Increasing number of festivals are now being held in Alnwick or areas of Berwick that are not within easy walking distance. - Parents are also able to attend some events -Festivals and events are often half a class or small group only, requiring additional staffing to enable children to attend	Our Year 3 & 4 children attended 7 inter school competitions and festivals this year, including those where the School Games team have only allowed specific groups to attend rather than a whole class.
Purchase additional sports resources and equipment	e.g. additional crash mats requested by Gymnastics coach by Spring 2025	£1490	-Continue to develop resources that will support delivery of quality PE lessons and sporting activities.	New P.E. benches were purchased to support gymnastics and other sporting activities. After consultation with our Sports Crew, additional equipment was purchased to support active play at breaktimes. Any money not spent on resources was used to support additional specialist activities to encourage and support the children in Early Years to engage in physical activities, e.g. a Yoga session and Boogie Beats.
Extend the school's core provision of swimming lessons for children in Key Stage 2 as our children live near the River Tweed and the North Sea coast.	Y3 & 4 weekly swimming lesson during Autumn Term. Additional action - Explore options for Y2 to return to weekly swimming lessons in the summer term	£1500	Ensuring all children in Y3 & 4 attend regularly and are taught life-saving and water safety skills.	Additional top up lessons allowed Year 3 and Year 4 to continue to develop their swimming skills throughout the year. Year 3 were able to attend an additional session on Drowning Prevention. Next year: extend swimming lessons to include Year 5 when we become a Primary school.
Provide supply for PE lead	6 x half day (one per half term)	£600	-To organise school PE sessions, after school PE activities and the school's involvement in inter school festivals and competitions and monitor quality of provision. - Monitor PE provision in school - Complete Northumberland games audit and evaluation - Liaise with NUFC to prepare for teaching of sport in upper Key	-P.E. lead monitored teaching of P.E. throughout the year and completed the audit for the School Games Mark. In 2025 -26 we will work towards moving from Gold to the Platinum Award. -P.E. lead is developing links with other local schools, including Berwick Academy, to help develop inter-school competitions as we move towards becoming a primary school. -P.E. lead has worked with staff to review our P.E. curriculum in preparation for becoming a primary school in September 2025. Next year: -Support staff who are changing age groups to build their confidence and expertise. - Arrange for Key Stage 2 staff to observe teaching of P.E. in Year 5 and 6 in an established primary school.
