1. Swimming CPD	£254	Upskill staff moving into new year groups and staff who are new to Key Stage 2 to build confidence in supporting effective swimming instruction by observing qualified swimming teachers	Staff gain confidence, ensuring sustainable, high-quality swimming instruction for future cohorts. Outcome (July 2026) Improving staff confidence and competence to support high-quality lessons and improved pupil progress.
2. External Coaching CPD	£5,510	Utilize external coaches to upskill staff and build confidence across key stages, including our first Year 5, as stage 1 of our transition from first school to primary school.	High-quality mentoring embeds long-term expertise, enabling teachers to deliver engaging PE independently. Outcome (July 2026) Teachers supported to deliver consistently high-quality PE lessons with reduced reliance on external coaching over time.
3. Internal Learning & Development	£546	Provide dedicated internal learning and development opportunities tailored to staff changing year groups, including our first Year 5, as stage 1 of our transition from first school to primary school.	Strengthens internal peer support, reinforces best practices, and ensures consistent PE delivery across all year groups. Outcome (July 2026) Increasing confidence & consistency in PE teaching across school and greater staff collaboration.

1. Inclusive After-School Clubs	£2,500	Deploy coaches and TAs to run weekly KS1 & KS2 clubs, ensuring full accessibility for SEND, medical needs, and Pupil Premium pupils.	Increased participation in extracurricular physical activity; fosters early engagement and inclusive sporting habits. Outcome (July 2026) Higher attendance at clubs, increased participation from targeted groups, and improved pupil wellbeing.
2. Internal Competitions	£200	Host inclusive internal sports competitions in Key Stage 2, with targeted TA support for pupils with SEND and medical needs.	Promotes healthy competition, teamwork, and school spirit while ensuring equal participation for all children. Outcome (July 2026) Increasing confidence, teamwork, resilience, and participation in competitive sport.
3. Top-Up Swimming	£800	Deliver extra top-up swimming & water safety sessions in the summer term for Years 3 and 5.	Accelerates progress toward standard national curriculum swimming/water safety requirements before pupils reach KS3. Outcome (July 2026) More pupils on track to achieve the National Curriculum expectation for swimming and water safety by the end of Year 6.
4. Playground Equipment	£450	Purchase new playground equipment to encourage active play, fun, and movement during break and lunch times. Also purchase wooden hockey sticks for new Year 5	Enhances daily physical activity levels and improves behaviour and engagement through structured play. Outcome (July 2026) Increased active play, reduced sedentary behaviour, and improved behaviour at lunchtimes.

1. School Games & Festivals	£1,500	Fund entry, transport and extra staffing support for a broad range of inter-school events (including targeted groups, single-sex events, and Year 5 competitions).	Broadens pupil horizons through diverse sports exposure, boosts school pride, and develops sportsmanship across varying skill levels. Outcome (July 2026) Increased participation in competitive sport with greater representation across all pupil groups.
2. External Coaching Staff	£5,000	Engage specialized external coaches to expand physical activity offerings and deliver expert session delivery (e.g. Newcastle Foundation, Boogie Beats, Northumberland Cricket Board, Sports Crew Training, Mr Skippy)	Exposes pupils to elite sports coaching, inspiring lifelong engagement and driving overall standards of physical activity. Outcome (July 2026) Improving pupil skills, engagement, enjoyment, and aspirations through access to specialist coaching.
